**SHALOM!**

When Jesus came into the world, angels sang about peace and when he went out of the world he bequeathed peace. He instructed his disciples when sending them on missions words be {shalom} peace be to this house” {Luke10:5}.

It was the same peace which prophet Isaiah fore told as coming in abundance: “Towards her I send peace flowing like a river” {Is 66:12}. For us to attain this peace we need to eschew from our lives: avarice, envy, anger, pride, violence and revenge.

The peace of Christ thus begins in one’s heart, but it is meant to flow into the heart of others, so that the personal peace becomes world peace. A story was told of a man who returned to his car which was parked outside a large shopping centre. Lying on the front seat was a note: Dear Sir, I fully intended to steal your car until I noticed the peace-be-to-you sticker in your car. It made me pause and reflect. I reasoned that if I did steal your car, you certainly would not be at peace and on the other hand, I felt I would not be at peace either as this was my first job. So Peace be to you and me. Drive safely and next time do not forget to lock your car. The note was signed: “A would be car thief”.

Peace in the world is our responsibility. But for us to give peace to the world, we must be at peace within ourselves because “nemo dat quod non habet” you cannot give what you do not have. Our task as children of God is to create peace based on justice and fair play. Shalom!

**UNDERSTANDING TODAY'S GOSPEL**

"Salute no one on the road." Jesus did not encourage social rudeness. He simply wanted his advance people to remain focused. Greeting people along the way meant socializing that could delay the missionaries. The time to socialize would come when the missionaries arrived at their destination.

"Peace to this house." This is a traditional Hebrew greeting that, in the context of the mission, has Messianic overtones. In other words, the Shalom of the greeting had a reason. The house should be at peace for the Lord was coming soon. 'Your peace will rest on him' Luke implied that once the word was spoken, peace had an existence independent of the speaker. The peace of the missionary rested on the house. The power of the peace came not only from the missionary, but from the Lord who commissioned the missionary.

"Take whatever food and drink they have to offer." The problem came when they passed through Gentile areas. If they stayed with Gentiles and ate their food they would become unclean.
