“When you spend a life chasing happiness you usually end up being miserable”!

I’ve no idea who made that remark but it seems a wise decision every now and then to review how we are spending our lives, where we are putting all our energy. Today, as Catholics throughout the world celebrate the feast of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, it seems appropriate to ponder what it means to be Christian in 2013 and review how much energy we’re putting into that endeavour!

For many years after Jesus died, people met in small groups to share His story and to break bread together. These people tried to pattern their lives on the way Jesus had described. Gradually, those people, who tried to imitate the way Jesus behaved, were called Followers of The Way. It was once dangerous to be a follower of The Way. Christian tradition recalls that it was in Antioch that followers of The Way were first called Christians. Throughout the last 2000 years, in many countries, Christians have suffered and many have died because they choose to follow Jesus. Today, Christians in many countries are being persecuted because they choose to cling to their faith.

How is the situation for us living in Australia? Last year, Brother Philip Pinto Congregational Leader of the Christian Brothers, posed this challenge. The first question any churchgoer should be asked and expected to answer is; “what are you willing to give up to follow Jesus?” What do we fear if we really lived Jesus’ vision for the world today? Remembering it was once dangerous to be a follower of The Way, are we and is our church still on the right track?

In this an election year in Australia, how could each of us in our family and in our parish community address the huge questions of growing poverty, of racism and of how to respect the dignity of all people who arrive on our shores? When we’re convinced the Holy Spirit is within each of us and try to address these human rights honestly, very gradually our church could become a place where all people will feel welcome at The Table.

May these words from the inaugural presidential address of Nelson Mandela convince each of us we can be liberated from our fears if only we believe. “Our deepest fear is not that we are inadequate. Our deepest fear is that we are powerful beyond measure. It is our light, not our darkness, that most frightens us. We ask ourselves; ‘Who am I to be brilliant, gorgeous, talented and fabulous?’ Actually, who are you NOT to be? You are a child of God. Your playing small doesn’t serve the world. There’s nothing enlightened about shrinking so that other people won’t feel insecure around you. We were born to make manifest the glory of God that is within us. It is not just in some of us: it’s in everyone. And as we let our light shine, we unconsciously give other people permission to do the same. As we are liberated from our own fear, our presence automatically liberates others.

FEAST DAYS OF THE WEEK

Monday, June 3 St Charles Lwanga and Companions
King Mwangi of Uganda launched persecutions of Christians in response to their opposition to his corrupt court. St Charles, the master of his pages, was martyred with four-teen other pages on June 3 1886.

Wednesday, June 5 St Boniface
Born in Devonshire, England, educated at the Benedictine monastery in Exeter, where he later became a monk. As a missionary to Germany and Archbishop of Mainz, he destroyed pagan temples and founded or restored many diocese. Preaching in Holland, he was set upon by a troop of pagans; Boniface and 52 of his flock were martyred.

Friday, June 7 Feast of the Sacred Heart
First celebrated in 1670, in Rennes, France, through the efforts of Fr Jean Eudes. The life story of Jesus as founded in the Gospels is a story of a heart full of sympathy. "And seeing the multitudes, he had compassion on them because they were like sheep without a shepherd" (Mark 6:34) He showed his sympathy and understanding towards discouraged sinners; towards the children who flocked to him. The parable of the Good Shepherd and the Prodigal son. No wonder people listened when he invited them—"Come to me all you who labour and are burdened, and I will give you rest."

Saturday, June 8 The Immaculate Heart of Mary
In 1944 Pope Pius XII extended the Feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary to the universal Church. Devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary is based on Scripture. In Luke's Gospel there are two references to the Heart of Mary. It was the Heart of Mary which expressed her 'yes' to God. Pope John Paul II in his first encyclical, *Redemptor Hominis*, wrote the mystery of Redemption was formed under the heart of the Virgin of Nazareth when she pronounced her decree"
