Last week, the Australian Bureau of Statistics nominated one baby born in a hospital at a specific time on a designated date to be the 23,000,000<sup>th</sup> Australian! All these Australians deserve a place to call 'home'.

Each week, hundreds of people from war-torn countries arrive in Australia searching for a new start in life and longing for a safe place to call 'home'.

Real Estate agents have many examples of different specifications couples describe when they are searching for a new 'family home'. What really constitutes a home? What meaning resonates with you when you hear the word 'home'? The age old question, "what makes a house a home?" is very relevant today as we ponder a story from the Gospel according to John.

I wonder what meaning Jesus intended when He used the word the 'home'? Jesus promised His disciples: "Those who love me will keep my word and my Father will love them and we will come to them and make our home with them".

Perhaps we experience being 'at home' with God when we are feeling at home with ourselves and feeling at home with the other people in our daily lives. ## MAY—THE MONTH OF MARY



The Catholic practice of assigning a special devotion to each month goes back to the early 16th century. Since the best known of these devotions is probably the dedication of May as the month of the Blessed Virgin Mary. It might come as a surprise that it wasn't until the late 18th century that this devotion arose among Jesuits in Rome. It quickly spread throughout the Western

Church, and by the time of Pope Pius IX's declaration of the dogma of the Immaculate Conception in 1854, it has become universal. The month of May is the month which the piety of the faithful has especially dedicated to Our Blessed Lady, and it is an occasion for a moving tribute of faith and love which Catholics in every part of the world pray to the Queen of Heaven. During this month Christians, both in church and in the privacy of the home, offer up to Mary from their hearts an especially fervent and loving homage of prayer and veneration. In this month too, the benefits of God's mercy come down to us from her throne in greater abundance.

#### YOUR PARISH

#### The parish has an indispensable mission.

In our day the parish still enjoys a new and promising season. At the beginning of his pontificate, Paul VI addressed the Roman clergy in these words; "We believe simply that this old and venerable structure of the parish has an indispensable mission of great contemporary importance; to create the basic community of the Christian people; to initiate and gather the people in the accustomed expression of liturgical life; to conserve and renew the faith in the people of today; to serve as the school for teaching the saving message of Christ; to put solidarity in practice and work the humble charity of good and brotherly works".

### We do have a wonderful Parish and incredible clergy and many events take place in our parish that are never mentioned.

In 2010 a young woman arrived in the Southport parish from India. Her name is Ponnu. She had achieved her Bachelor Degree in Pharmacy while in India and came to Australia to attend university to study for her Masters Degree. Ponnu approached the parish seeking suitable accommodation and a notice was placed in the Newsletter. At the same time a parishioner named June had lost her husband, she had a big house and rang the parish office offering accommodation. This association was 'truly made in heaven.' Ponnu is a devout catholic and said she had said 100 rosaries to find accommodation. Ponnu and June have shared Junes house now for over two years. In January Ponnu returned to India to marry. June also went to India to attend the wedding. In May Ponnu sits for her Masters Degree and her life may change, while her husband resides in London. Meanwhile Ponnu and June live happily together thanks to 100 rosaries.


