In my short time as priest, I have thoroughly enjoyed the hospital chaplaincy work, deeming it to be a privilege to minister to those in need of encouragement and the sacraments.

My Seminary study and training were undertaken at the Holy Spirit Seminary Brisbane with the Rector Monsignor Tony Randazzo, now Auxiliary Bishop in Sydney. Before taking a dramatic change in life by going to the seminary, I had various working experiences through my life. For example, I have managed a number of Pizza Hut Restaurants; and I owned and operated my own Restaurant and Takeaway food set-up for a number of years. I also have had the great opportunity of assisting the wonderful people at Mercy Disability Woolloowin as a support worker.

It was at this time that I first heard God's call to priesthood. Perhaps to distract myself from that call, I kept working hard, and kept reasoning and saying to myself that I was too old to go to the seminary. But the good Lord kept nudging me and moving me daily towards the idea of the Seminary, and I finally said, "Yes."

Once at the Seminary, I must admit going back to formal University study was daunting, to say the least, but with persistence and all I had learnt in my working life I completed my studies. I had a year of Internship at the Sunnybank Parish, and was ordained Deacon in June 2014 and Priest later that year.

I am looking forward to serving you all, the wonderful people who make up this exciting Parish to which I am called by God to serve. Unfortunately, I will be going on Annual Leave on Tuesday, 8 October, for four weeks, an arrangement that had been planned for the past twelve months. I return to you all on the 6 November.

I will keep you in my prayers, and I ask you to keep me in your prayers. God Bless.
