



The feast of the Holy Trinity brings us face to face with the foundation of our faith. The readings for today provide answers to the question: Who is God? They can really only suggest something about the mystery of God, and they can do this only indirectly. They call to mind some of the wonders that God has accomplished for us and in us. It is through reflection on these gracious divine acts that we can get glimpses of God.

The psalm declares that the harmony and interdependence that we see in creation point to a majestic creator responsible for it all. The account of the history of God's people reveals a God who desires to establish an intimate relationship with them, enters their history as protector and guide, and forgives disloyalty. Finally, Jesus teaches that God sent him into the world to save it, has made us adopted children through the Holy Spirit, and will ultimately clothe us in divine glory. It is from his teaching that we hear that the Son was sent by the Father, the Spirit, which was also his Spirit, proceeded from the Father and from him.

From our own experience, we know that God creates, because we are immersed in creation. We know that God saves, because we have been freed from the bondage of our own demons. Our experience tells us that God is with us, and that God is for us. Everything that we know about God declares that God is passionately in love with us, boundlessly so!

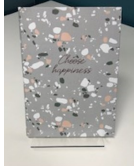

MONTH OF THE SACRED HEART

June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus so we will be offering many opportunities for devotions at Guardian Angels, the highlight being the great **Feast of the Sacred Heart at Guardian Angels on 11th June at 12:30.**

During June we have exposition of the Blessed Sacrament **every Friday at 12 Noon** followed by the litany to the Sacred Heart prior to Mass at 12:30.

On the **First Friday** of the month there will be Benediction immediately following Mass.

On the **Fourth Friday** we will follow the way of the cross at 12 noon using the newly installed stations of the cross with Mass to follow. Don't forget Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is on **every Wednesday from 12 noon to 1 pm** with Hymns, Rosary and Benediction, sacrament Confession is available.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS - UPDATE



Our recent Lenten program at Guardian Angels showed there is great devotion to praying the Way of the Cross as a meditation on Our Lords passion. This led to the idea of renewing the old 14 stations with new larger and clearer ones made by the Demetz family in Italy.

They have now all been fully sponsored including a 15th resurrection station. We would like to thank all the generous parishioners that participated. If there is interest in sponsoring new stations of the cross at Mary Immaculate and St Josephs, please contact Maria at our gift shop, Five stations have already been sponsored for Mary Immaculate, and one for St Joseph the Worker, the cost is \$1000 each.

We are expecting to install the new stations at Guardian Angels soon with a special Blessing Mass to be held on a Friday afternoon to be advised.
