



God chooses ordinary people and confers on them an extraordinary responsibility. Amos was a shepherd and a dresser of sycamores. Most of the apostles were fishermen. Paul was a tentmaker. Christians today are mechanics and clerks, teachers and engineers, doctors and housekeepers. These are all people following ordinary trades or professions, but what they do in them is truly remarkable. They touch minds and hearts and souls, and they heal them. They instruct and comfort people, and they help to drive out the demons that possess them. They

participate in very ordinary ways in the extraordinary establishment of the reign of God.

Jesus inaugurated the reign of God on earth. He chose disciples and sent them out to continue the work that he had begun, to preach his gospel and, through healings and exorcisms, to conquer the forces of evil that threatened that reign. And now we have been called; in him we have been chosen, in all of our brokenness and vulnerability. The task to which we have been called is awe-inspiring; and every spiritual blessing in the heavens has been bestowed upon us so that we will be able to accomplish it. If we allow Christ's saving power to take possession of us, we too will further his prophetic ministry. We will bring the saving grace of God to the world that is terrified and that writhes in pain; we will bring it to those places where healing is needed and where demons still hold sway. We will bring all things under the headship of Christ.

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### **Why do we stand, sit and kneel at times in the Mass?**

You go to Mass. You kneel. You sit. You stand. You sit. You Kneel. Sometimes it feels like a workout! Why do we keep changing positions?

Prayer is all about communicating with God. We often use words or thoughts to pray, but we can also pray through our actions. This is sometimes called body prayer.

We make the sign of the cross several times during the Mass to connect ourselves with the death of Jesus on the cross and to identify ourselves as Christians.

When the Romans saw the early Christians kneeling in prayer, they were shocked. They thought it was shameful to be in the position of slaves or defeated enemies, but the Christians took the position for the Jewish people. Kneeling was a way of showing that we are humble before God and that we are servants of God's love. Kneeling is a sign of deep respect for God.

Another way to show respect is to stand. For example, we stand to sing O Canada. At Mass we stand to listen to the Gospel, where we meet Jesus in the reading. We also stand for other key moments of the Mass.

*During the sharing of the sign of peace at Mass, we greet, shake hands with or hug people to wish them peace. This practice goes back to the earliest days of the Church.*

Dear parishioners and visitors, what great news from the Queensland Premier. We can gather as a community of faith and celebrate the faith we share in the Risen Lord. However, as we gather please may we keep in mind that the outbreak is not over and we are expected to adhere to these recommendations.

- Registering for Mass is required using the Check In QLD QR Code or Sign In Sheets.
- Standing not allowed.
- When all the seats are occupied, seats will be placed at the entrance of the church.
- Parishioners are required to process to receive Holy Communion while social distancing.
- Designated Parishioners wearing their mask will go round with the offertory baskets.
- Masks will be mandatory in Church. Face masks must be worn at all times during Mass and can only be removed while receiving Holy Communion.
- Clergy and readers who are socially distanced from others may remove their masks while reading or speaking and then put it back on.
- Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist must wear a face mask while administering Holy Communion.
- Indoor venues including places of worship will return 1 person per 4 square metres inside and 1 person per 2 square metres outdoors.
- Funerals and Weddings held indoors: One person per 4 square metres up to the limit allowed in the space or 100 people, whichever number is lower.
- It is still very important that marshals continue to record contact information so that parishes can provide details if contact tracing is ever required.

### **NEW LAWS TARGETING SEXUAL OFFENCES AGAINST CHILDREN**

#### **Child sexual offence**

A *child sexual offence* is an offence of a sexual nature committed against a child and includes:

- Indecent treatment of a child
  - Carnal knowledge with or of a child
  - Rape
  - Incest
  - Grooming a child (or their parent or carer)
  - Making child exploitation material
  - Maintaining a sexual relationship with a child
- Indecent treatment of a child* covers a range of conduct of a sexual nature. Examples may include:

- fondling a child in a sexual manner
- having the child touch a sexual body part
- taking a sexual photograph of a child.

*Grooming a child (or their parent or carer)* refers to the way some offenders form relationships and build trust with children, parents, carers, teachers and other children in order to get close to a child and create the opportunity for sexual abuse. It can be difficult to identify because the behaviour itself may not be abusive or sexual. Grooming can often occur online.

#### **Why the laws are needed**

Children need the adults around them to take action to protect them from sexual abuse. The new offences target behaviour that ignores or hides the sexual abuse of children.

**The Archdiocese has zero-tolerance for  
all forms of abuse. Safeguarding  
is everyone's responsibility.**
